

Jean-Marie Sander was born on 23 December 1949, he is a French politician and banker. After working as an agricultural operator in agricultural trade unionism, he became involved in local political life. He was elected mayor of the city of Ohlungen in 1995.

In 1993, he was appointed Chairman of the “Caisse régionale Alsace Vosges”, a position he still holds today.

Between 2003 and 2010, he held the presidency of the National Federation of Agricultural Credit.

In May 2010, he left the Federation and became Chairman of the group's publicly traded holding, Crédit Agricole.

Political career

In 1983 he was elected municipal councilor and deputy mayor of the village of Ohlungen, of which he became mayor in 1995.

In the same year, he became deputy for RPR deputy Bernard Schreiner.

From 1998 to 2007, he was President of the Economic and Social Council of Alsace.

Professional career

He was Chairman of SAS Rue La Boétie and Caisse Régionale de Crédit Agricole Mutuel (CRCAM) Alsace Vosges He served as the Chairman of Credit Agricole S.A. since May 19, 2010 until November 4, 2015.

He served as Deputy Chairman of Credit Agricole SA from May 21, 2003 to May 2010.

He serves as Deputy Chairman of SACAM Développement SAS.

He served as Vice-Chairman of Credit Agricole SA since May 20, 1999.

He serves as Director of Électricite de Strasbourg Société Anonyme.

He serves as Director of CFM Indosuez Wealth S/A.

He has been a Director Calyon Bank Czech Republic A.S. since 2004.

He served as a Director of Credit Agricole S.A. since May 20, 1999 until November 4, 2015 Mr. Sander served as a Director of LCL.

He served as a Director of Crédit Agricole Corporate and Investment Bank (also known as Calyon S.A).
